

Washington, June 13. In the Senate the compromise bill was taken up, and Mr. Bright of Indiana, addressed the committee in favor of it.

Mr. Clay presented the resolutions of the compromise meeting at St. Louis. This called up Mr. Benton, who denounced in his usual style.

Mr. Webster has now the floor and is speaking in favor of all the compromise propositions.

Washington, June 13.—T. M. In the Senate the nominations of Benj. Hiddle, as Consul at Chihuahua, and Daniel Riggs, as Judge of the United States Court of Arkansas, were confirmed.

Capt. Dodge publishes a card in the Intelligencer denying that he was one of the five said to have been shot at Cardenas.

Mr. Webster finished his speech upon the compromise. He was in favor of settling the question of boundary between New Mexico and Texas in this bill, mainly on the ground that it would prevent collision between the people of the two States.

Mr. Seward spoke in favor of the claims of the United States to the disputed territory. He said the United States had assumed the debts of Texas, and therefore she was bound to pay them, but he would not vote a cent to pay for her claim to a portion of New Mexico.

Mr. Clemens moved to file the blank bill for the purchase of the Texas claim to the disputed territory with one million of dollars.

Mr. Clay opposed the motion and said the motion to file the blank should be made on the third reading of the bill. He replied to the remarks of Mr. Seward, and charged that gentleman and the Administration with obstructing, and with delaying public business.

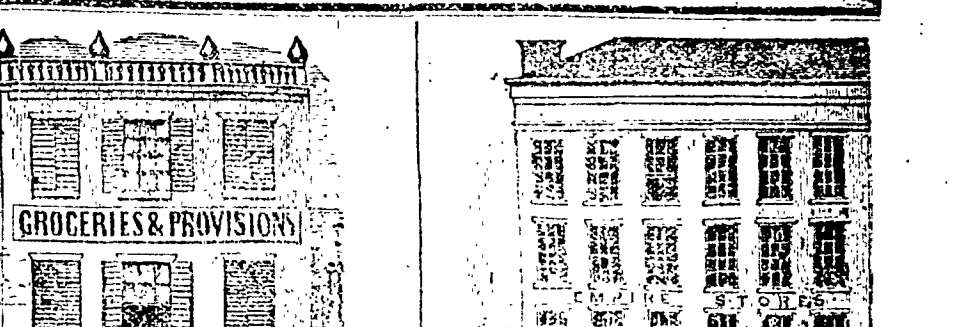
