New York, Jan. 26.

The Court and Jury were in attendance at 10 o'clock this morning. The Foreman, in answer to the Clerk, said that the Jury had agreed. The seal-verdict was then opened and read, as follows:

"That the jury find Mr. Forrest guilty of adultery with Mrs. Forrest, and that the said Mrs. Forrest is entitled to a divorce from Mr. Forrest, and that she shall be allowed \$3000 a year, alimony."

The Counsel on both sides, Mr. and Mrs. Forrest, were present.

There was much excitement among the spectators, but the verdict is considered a righteous one.

Official Stephens arrested Daniel W. Townsend, late President of the Bowers Bank, charging him with obtaining \$2000 from S. W. B. & A. Miles, \$500 from C. S. Matthews—\$500 from Chester Driggs, and various other sums from other citizens, which is alleged, in the year 1843, induced to become stockholders in a manufacturing establishment, called the Caledonian Steam Jacket Manufacturing Co., 63 & 65 Centre street, which was conducted by A. W. Metcalf, who failed in 1847, and in the following year commenced business by the aid of Mr. Townsend, who, it is alleged, put in a capital of \$1000, drawn from the Bank of which he was then President, in the name of Metcalf & Co. It has since been ascertained by the stockholders, that the concern was mortgaged for \$65,000, when Townsend persuaded them to embark in the enterprise.

Motions were made in the Superior Court (this morning) by Mr. Van Buren, Counsel for Mr. Forrest, to say proceedings to enable him to prepare a bill of exceptions.

Mr. O'Connor, in behalf of Mrs. Forrest, moved that judgment be given on the verdict of the jury, dissolving the marriage contract, and that the Court press up on the alimony and fix the same at \$3000 per year.

The Court adjourned the hearing of both motions until Saturday.

BRANDY ATTEMPT.—Pliny mentions the case of a young man of high rank, who having expired some time, as it was thought, was placed upon the funeral pile. The friends of the flames revived him, but he perished before the friends could rescue him. The great anatomist, Vesalius, had an un-pardonable misfortune to commence the dissection of a living body, apparently dead. Less unhappy was the fate of the Abbe Provost, who fell in an attempt to revive a man, who recovered his consciousness late in the evening. Preparations were made to embalm the body of Cardinal Sanguinetti. The operator had scarcely penetrated into the chest when the heart was found to beat. Returning partially to his senses, he had sufficient strength to push away the knife, but the lung was mortally wounded. In one of our journals is recorded the strangely interesting case of the Rev. Mr. Tennant, of New Jersey, who lay three days in his shroud, and was saved from interment almost by a miracle. We had a collection by Brother of no less than fifty-two cases of persons buried alive; four dissected prematurely, three who recovered after being confined and buried, and two who were buried.

THE TROOP DOCTRINE.—The New York Sun says: A very simple reason may be given for the opposition of the officers of the navy to the abolition of flogging—their discipline is not so perfect without the lash. There are a few Captains of merchant vessels who would favor the continuance of the lash, as one of poor Jack's "tricks," for the same reason, yet the merchant service has not suffered by the abolition of flogging. In the navy, however, it has become more frequent, since the discipline of the lash was abolished. The Naval officers who cannot maintain subordination in their vessels by other means than the use of the lash, are not properly qualified for their position and position. Authority can only be maintained by a barbarous punishment—such as a humane man would not, for any consideration, inflict upon a brave man, should exist in the white Naval system be revolutionized, rather than the law of the lash be re-erected.

A RABBI IN THE LEGISLATURE.—We notice that, before the commencement of business in the Senate at New York, on Monday last, the prayer, which is usually offered, was made by Rabbi Wise, the minister of the Jewish Synagogue in Albany. Rabbi Wise is a German by birth, and is one of the most distinguished of the Hebrew Clergy in this country. His writings have great force, and are marked with distinguished ability.—N. Y. Express.

News by the America—Terrible Disaster—Burning of a Steamer.

The America's news confirms the statement of the burning of the steamer Amazon, of the West India Line.

The Amazon, under command of Capt. Simmons, sailed from Southampton, with mail and passengers, on the 21st inst. When two days out, and about 110 miles south of West Scylla Island, she was discovered to be on fire. The flames burst out at an early hour in the morning of the 4th, and in ten minutes after, so rapidly did the flames spread, the ship was completely gutted. She subsequently burst to the water's edge, when her boiler exploded, and the hull immediately sunk.

By this terrible disaster, 41 passengers and 59 of the officers and crew are known to have perished. Captain Simmons and his four chief officers, the Surgeon, and Elliot Warburton, the celebrated author of "The Cruise of the Cross," were among the sufferers. Many of the passengers, from the appalling rapidity with which the flames spread, were either burned or suffocated in their berths. As soon as every effort to subdue the flames had failed, the boats were attempted to be launched, but owing to the construction which prevailed on all sides, a desperate race was made for them, and before they could be got well into the water, they were swamped along side of the steamer, and every soul in them lost. Two other boats were successfully launched, and thus 9 passengers and 32 seamen succeeded in escaping from the burning wreck.

They were shortly picked up, one party by an English and the other by a Dutch vessel, and safely landed at Plymouth and Brest. She was a new and magnificent steamer and very richly furnished. The loss is immense.

The origin of the fire remains a mystery.

The day previous to the departure of the steamer America, intelligence had reached Liverpool of the total loss of the New York Brig Columbia, Capt. Curran, on the 7th inst. off the Irish coast, near Waterford. Two cabin and two steerage passengers, together with eight of the crew, perished, and Capt. Curran, his officers, and the remainder of the passengers and crew succeeded in reaching the shore.

ESSEX.—The London "Times," speaking of the report relative to a change in the Ministry, says "We merely state the fact as we believe it to be—that the attempt to effect a partial change in the Ministry by the substitution of two or three new members for others of the present Ministry, who would retire, have not led to any result. It seems therefore, the determination of Lord John Russell, to meet Parliament without any material alteration in the Ministry."

The "Morning Herald" has left Paris, to be present at the Peace Council to be held at Windsor on the 10th inst.

The "Daily News" copies a statement from a Hamburg paper, to the effect that the Turkish Government has addressed a note to the English Government, protesting against the return of Koush to England, as it is a usurper who has been granted on condition that he should take up his residence in the United States, and the restoration of friendly relations between Turkey and Austria, renders it necessary that these conditions should be fulfilled.

FRANCE.—Political affairs are without striking importance. The feeling against the Ministry is becoming stronger every day and it is thought a dissolution must inevitably take place before the meeting of parliament.

The Times have placed that matters are not a very perplexing condition and it is possible that the Ministry may succeed in weathering out the storm. On the other hand it is said that the President is uniting his strength with the friends of Lord Palmerston and by their combined efforts the Premier will be compelled to give way.

The accounts from Cape of Good Hope are of a very unsatisfactory nature.

An engagement had taken place between the natives and the English troops, in which the latter were defeated with a loss of several officers and several hundred men.

Extensive operations were making on the part of the troops to retrieve their disaster, but they had not resulted in any satisfactory manner. On the contrary, in some slight skirmishes, the natives were again victorious.

FRANCE.—France continues quiet. The promulgation of the new constitution has been deferred for ten days.

The President continues to meet with decided approbation from all classes.

A report has arisen that a misunderstanding had occurred between the English Ambassador Lord Normanby, and Louis Napoleon, which had resulted in the former declaring his intention to take a formal leave of the French Government. This report caused a decline in the Bourse, but affairs soon rallied and at the close, the market was firm.

GERMANY.—Affairs are without much alteration. The project of Louis Napoleon annex a portion of Germany is looked upon with great distrust and it is thought that should he attempt to put it into execution that a war would follow.

EARS.—The Sunday Globe is severe but just in saying the people of the cities make but paltry use of themselves, in vain efforts to please foreigners, to run after every importation, and to ape the appearance and manners of distinguished men from abroad. We unheeded the horses from Fanny Eweller's carriage, and made asses of ourselves, and drawn of burthens. We feasted and toasted Marryatt, and he goes back to England and writes us down asses. We celebrated the revolution in France, and it turns out that revolutions do sometimes go backwards, and it is no great shame of a democracy after all. We expended all our means in hearing Jenny Lind, the nightingale, sing her "Bird Song," and now we are engaged in giving public receptions, banquets, and raising money to a talented foreigner, who knowing our disposition for show, and how readily we are humbugged, comes among us to stir up feuds, preach a new kind of democracy to a people who have practiced it since the revolution achieved by our forefathers, have himself feasted and toasted, traveled from one end of the country to the other, that his vanity may be gratified at our expense. Verily, we are asses of a long growth, and we will not hide the length of our ears.
