Harper, the Chickasaw agent .-During the conflict, Chin-chi-kee, captain of the Light Horse, killed three of his opponents with his knife, after which he was himself shot through the head by a Seminole who is yet at large, but a form al demand has been made for him.

A FATAL MEETING .- A correspondent of the Genins of Liberty writes that a fatal accident occurred at Big Tunnel, on the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad. The hands working from each end of the tunnel were about meeting, but those from the west end had advanced farther than was anticipated, and in setting off a blast opened the communication resulting is the most fatal consequences to the workmen in east end. Out of eleven men, one named Richard Carter was killed, and eight others dreadfully, some mortally wounded. The distance between them was but eight feet.


