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The Explosion on the Steamer Reindeer—Between 50 and 60 killed and soiled.

Our Citizens were startled on Saturday afternoon by the announcement that the steamer Reindeer had burst her boiler near Bristol, killing nine persons and severely wounding twenty-five others.

The Reindeer had on board over 800 passengers at the time of the explosion, most of whom were from the promenade deck.
