New York.

Receipts of Gold.—The receipts of gold at the Mint at Philadelphia, during the month of November, have been seven million five hundred and thirty thousand dollars. This is the largest amount ever deposited in any one month.

The exports of specie to Europe, in November, are less than \$900,000.

The imports at N. Y., during November, amounted to \$8,736,062, being nearly three millions of dollars over the receipts of the corresponding month last year. Over one million of the increase was in dry goods, the receipts of which have increased nearly 60 per cent. The imports for the year, however, the Journal of Commerce estimates to be over half a million less than during the same period last year.

The Baltimore Sun referring to the official documents relating to the proposed purchase of Cuba, under Mr. Polk's administration, says: "These papers, from the beginning exhibit the consistent action of the United States, and the integrity of purpose by which our Government has always been actuated. There has been no interference by the United States in any way with the supremacy of Spain, but the avowal of a steadfast adherence to aid her in maintaining it against all assaults. The United States Government has consistently expressed its opinion that Cuba should be under any circumstances, pass into the hands of any power; and has made known the prevailing sentiment of our people on this point, both to France and England. Notwithstanding this, it is manifest that England has entertained designs upon the island, and has resorted to dishonorable intrigues for the accomplishment of her purposes, and thus attempted to conceal them from the United States. The vigilance of the American Government has, however, succeeded in detecting them, and in thwarting the projects which they would have effected."
