WASHINGTON LETTER.

WASHINGTON, March 6th, 1899. Considering that they controlled only one branch of the Fifty-fifth Congress, the Republicans have every reason to be proud of the record left by that Congress, which has been in several respects one of the most remarkable in our history.

Although the question had already been decided in the negative by President McKinley and his advisers, making legislation upon it unnecessary, the Foraker amendment to the Army bill, declaring that no property franchises in Cuba during its military occupancy, is warmly welcomed by the officials, because it will put a stop to the applications for such franchises.

The Nicaragua Canal amendment to the River and Harbor bill, as finally agreed upon, authorizes the President to appoint a Commission of Engineers to investigate the Nicaragua and Panama Canal routes, and report to him in time for him to report to the next Congress, and appropriates \$1,000,000 to pay expenses.

The House succeeded in compelling the Senate to agree to the number of new warships authorized by the original House Naval bill, but the limitation of the cost of armor to \$300 a ton, in the bill as finally agreed to, makes it impossible to make any contract for constructing the battleships provided for, without further legislation.
