The extension of the New York and Pennsylvania railroad from Millport to Shingle House will in all probability be completed this season. All is in readiness to do the work within three months after the right of way is secured. The survey has been made and the line located to Ceres, four miles farther and will be continued an additional five miles to Portville, where it will connect with the Pennsylvania's newly acquired line from Buffalo to Emporium.

The Goodyears have gangs of men working on their branch railroad, which will run from Bailey Run, Potter county, to the P. & E. road, at Sinnamahoning. The engineers have nearly completed the survey of the line, which is about sixteen miles long, they only having about four miles yet before they reach the terminus. The graders are at work on the Bailey Run line, while other gangs are locating the camps, etc. Operations on the line have been in progress about two weeks. The Goodyears by this line will pass through the timber tracts on the Sinnamahoning, and also expect to go into the coal tracts along Dent's Run.—Austin Autograph.

Uncle Sam's family is becoming a large one. There were but 5,300,000 people in America when the century opened. France had five times as many people; Germany and even Austria, had four times America's population; Italy had three times as many, and so had Great Britain. Even Spain had double our number of people, and little Portugal was almost our rival in numbers. We have more people now than any European nation except Russia which alone leads us. We have as many people as live in all Great Britain and France combined. We have one-half more people than Germany. We have, practically, 75,000,000 people in the United States, and 10,000,000 more in our new possessions.
