A LOCAL CONTEST

Pittsburg Election Has No Bearing Upon State Politics.

THE STALWARTS ARE PLEASED

Philadelphia's Splendid Majority Will Surely Be Increased in the Fall Campaign, Say Her Republican Leaders.

Harrisburg, Feb. 25.—Now that they have had time to make an analysis of the returns of the recent election in this state, Republicans of Pennsylvania have every reason to be pleased with the outcome of the balloting.

In many clean-cut contests in counties in which there were heretofore fusion movements the regular Republicans carried everything before them at last week's election.

The insurgent organization formed in the deadlock over the United States senatorship by members of the legislature identified with the bolting element no longer exists.

These newspapers are now seeking to convey the impression that the result of the recent election in Pittsburg means the annihilation of the present leadership of the Republican organization of the state, and that the election of a Democrat to the office of controller of Pittsburg is going to have a far-reaching influence upon the action of the coming Republican state convention.

The facts of the case are that this was a local contest pure and simple. There was a bitter factional struggle between rival elements within the Republican organization of Pittsburg.

In view of the associations which many of them had before this contest was started, Republicans throughout the state concluded not to meddle in this family row, and the contest was waged absolutely upon local issues.

It has no bearing upon state politics, and the result of the election will not in any way influence the action of the coming state convention.

Of course to serve factional and personal ends the Wanamaker and Democratic newspapers throughout the state have been printing stories to the effect that Flinn's defeat will seriously affect the movement in favor of the nomination of Attorney General John P. Elkin for governor.

PHILADELPHIA'S BIG MAJORITY. By the official returns just computed today the Republican candidate for city solicitor in Philadelphia, John L. Kinsey, has a plurality of 119,398 over the candidate of the Democracy and the Municipal League, who received but 35,384 votes, representing the combined strength of these organizations as against 154,692 polled by the Republican nominee.

These figures tell their own story. They show an absolute collapse of the Wanamaker movement or insurgent outfit in Pennsylvania politics.
