WASHINGTON LETTER.

(From our Regular Correspondent.) Washington, May 26th., 1902.

Editor Press:

The sudden death of Lord Pouncefote, after an illness which was known to be serious but which no one thought would terminate fatally, has cast a shadow over official and social life in Washington, which is in marked contrast to the gaiety which marked the ceremonies attendant upon the unveiling of the Rochambeau statue.

Lord Pouncefote, G. C. B., G. C. M. G., came to the United States as the diplomatic representative of his government in 1893 and the whole course of his career as British Ambassador in Washington has been a decided success. He, with Secretary Olney, drafted the general arbitration treaty between the United States and Great Britain, which treaty was the forerunner of the great work in the interest of peace accomplished at the Hague convention.

The unveiling of the Rochambeau statue which took place on Saturday was great success. While the Marine Band played the national air of France, the "Marseillaise", the Countess de Rochambeau drew the cord which let fall the French and American flags with which the statue was draped and, as the troops of the two nations presented arms, the guns of the Fourth Battalion boomed out the national salute on the field back of the White House.

While the Philippine debate still occupies the attention of the Senate the monotony of the proceedings has been somewhat varied by the speeches of Senators Hoar and Beveridge. The address of the former, while regarded by his colleagues as somewhat visionary and chimerical, was a remarkably eloquent production and held the closest attention of his auditors for upwards of three hours.

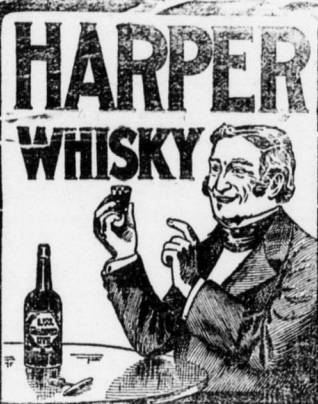
