The election is over and now all we will hear for sometime is "how it happened."

Politicians out for office have had many opportunities to furnish coal to the poor this fall.

October was indeed a warm month. Now that the election is over we trust the weather will change.

Cleveland has a touch of the political fever. He says the Democratic opportunity has arrived.

The meat combine is still combining and indications are that it will include all kinds of foodstuffs.

After the politicians got through, the tax payers and citizens came forward and played the winning cards in the political game.

Cold weather has apparently been awaiting the settlement of the coal strike. Will someone notify November that it is over.

The government has just withdrawn from public entry 6,000,000 more acres of public land in California, in different tracts, and forest reserves will probably be created.

The arbitration commission has made a very thorough investigation of the coal miners, and now the miners are wondering what the harvest will be.

English army statistics show that out of every 100 bullets which hit soldiers in war, 39 will lodge in the legs, 30 in the arms, 20 in the trunk of the body, 1 in the neck and 10 in the head, on the average.

We are now in the Thanksgiving month. What have you had or what have you got to be thankful for? Every person certainly has something for which to offer thanks.

And now the American people are grumbling because it is proposed to take the duty off of foreign coal. They say that it is not nearly so good as the American fuel.

One of our exchanges says: "Miss Anna Dann, for years private secretary to Miss Susan B. Anthony, was married a few days ago at the home of a lady friend by Rev. Miss Anna Shaw. No mention is made of the groom, but it is presumed that he was a man."

Roswell Peardsley, aged 93 years, of North Lansing, N. Y., is the oldest postmaster in the country. He has held the office for 74 years and expects to continue in Uncle Sam's service for sometime to come. Mr. Peardsley has survived 20 presidents, and 35 postmaster generals.

According to the report forwarded to the minister of education, children who are 4 years old should sleep 12 hours; children who are 7 years old, 11 hours; children who are 9 years old, 10 hours; children who are from 12 to 14 years old, from 9 to 10 hours, and those who are from 14 to 21 years old, from 9 to 10 hours.

Expert handwriting evidence has received a severe blow in New York. In the trial of the Moliniaux case the prosecution had handwriting experts to prove that Moliniaux did address and write certain letters, and the defense had an equal number of experts to prove that he did not write them. Both sides have proved that they were right.

According to figures recently compiled, the death rate in Ireland is considerably in excess of that of other countries in the United Kingdom and on the continent. The figures show that the death rate in Belfast is 21.3 per thousand, in Waterford 21.9 in Londonderry 22.6 in Cork and Limerick 24.3, and in Dublin 29.5. On this showing, Dublin, a city of less than 400,000 inhabitants, has a much higher death rate than any city in the United States with a population in excess of 100,000. In fact, the only two cities of this size in the United States to approach the figures of Dublin are New Orleans, with a death rate of 28.9 per thousand, and Memphis, with a death rate of 25.1 per thousand.

Hon. S. R. Dresser, by his magnificent run for Congress in a new district, carrying every county therein, even Center county, which is generally counted in the Democratic column, has put himself in line for governor of the state. It will be a western man next time and Bradford would be eligible, geographically. Mr. Dresser would make a capable and winning candidate.—Bradford Star.

The Elk county Republicans had two gentlemen by the name of Blank on their ticket. It is needless to say that they were both overwhelmingly defeated. According to the news that comes from that end of this judicial district the breed of Republicans are not so much noted for stalwartism as they might be. The instances referred to above are those of two Republicans who flunked off the ticket when it was no longer possible to get the vacancies filled. We wonder if Boss Hall has sequestered the Elk county Republicans so much that they have lost their vitality.—Lock Haven Times.

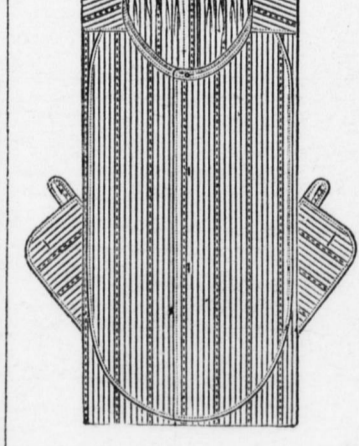
