No Cloud on the Horizon.

Those persons who imagined they saw the end of this era of prosperity foreshadowed in decreasing exports last spring will have to guess again. The movement during the closing months of last year altered the record and put 1902 at the top of the list of export years. The imports were also very large, but the balance continues in favor of the United States. Along the same lines are the reports of American Consuls abroad, which are being compiled for the annual government publication, "Commercial Relations." Mr. Emory, in charge of the matter, says the reports are all of one tenor, that American exports of manufactures will continue to increase. The cause is not wholly to be found in the cheapness of American products, but more in their excellence. American machinery is superior in every respect, and is especially popular on account of its lightness and the advantage of being readily able to procure duplicate parts. American agricultural products are necessarily in demand abroad, so that, as far as the export outlook is concerned, there is not a cloud on the horizon.
