

The attention of candidates is called to the fol-

The attention of candidates is called to the fol-lowing rules: SECTON 7. - All persons desiring to be voted for at at the Primary Elections for any office, whether State, District or County, shair register their names with the Chairman, and shail pay him a registration fee at the same time; this reg-sistration to be made not less than ElFTEEN days preceding the Primary Election. The Chairman shail publish and furnish to the Chair-man of the Vigilance Committees with the elec-tion blanks and tickets a cutified list of candi-dates, who have compiled with the rules, and no candidate shail be voted far at the primary elec-tions unless he has compiled with the rules regu-lating registration. The tickets shail be as near-lay as may be in the same form as the tickets for general elections and to be wided for in the same way.






