St. Petersburg, Aug. 2.—The great-st anxiety prevails here for news of general advance against the southern and eastern positions of Gen.

Kuropatkin's army.

Keller's death is confirmed. He was killed July 29 while repelling the pre-liminary attack of Kuroki's army on the Yangze pass, 30 miles east of Liao Yang. The general was standing near

#### JAPS WIN TWO BATTLES.

These two places are 26 miles apart, but the two actions were fought at the same time. The Russians held strong positions.

At Yushulikzu the Russians had two divisions of infantry and some artil-lery, and they resisted the Japanese assaults vigorously.


