DEATH'S DOINGS.

HORNING, SR.
At the home of his son, Amos Horning, Jr., near Howards Siding the venerable Mr. Horning passed away at the advanced age of 83. The immediate cause of his death was from injuries received by falling in the yard at his son's home.

He was born near Norristown, Pa., and enjoyed the advantages of a good education. He became an active business man in Philadelphia in early manhood, giving employment to many men, sometime in the 60's he moved to Kersey, Elk Co., engaging in the coal business, in the year 1872 he moved to Penfield engaging in the hardware business, where he lived until he moved to Emporium. He was converted over fifty years ago in St. Georges Church Philadelphia, and was a staunch supporter of old Methodism; his exemplary christian life was an inspiration to all with whom he associated.

The funeral services were held at the residence of his son July 27th 1904, services were conducted by Rev. R. A. Robertson assisted by Rev. Sypher of the Cameron circuit. There was a large attendance of relatives and friends at the services, about seventy going to the cemetery with the bereaved family. He leaves a widow and one son and many friends to mourn his loss.
