The public know that all this is simply not true. The Democratic Conception of Liberty

In our article commending Mr. Howard's speech of acceptance we remarked incidentally that "the conception of liberty which the Democratic party has always cherished is that of mere absence of restraint. This statement has given offense to one of the Independent's assistant editors because it was not properly understood.

Thomas Jefferson, while recognizing the necessity of government for the maintenance of order, nevertheless stood forth as the champion of liberty rather than of law. There is greater danger, he thought, of law overriding liberty than there is of liberty overturning law. He therefore set himself to keep the functions of government down to the lowest possible notch consistent with the demands of public order.
