

ELECTION PROCLAMATION.

I, Harry Hemphill, High Sheriff of the county of Cameron, in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, do hereby make known and give notice to the electors of the County of Cameron, Pa., that an election will be held in the said county on Tuesday the 8th day of November, A. D., 1904, it being the Tuesday following the first Monday of November, (the polls to be opened at 7 o'clock A. M. and closed at 7 o'clock P. M.) at which time the freemen of Cameron county will vote by ballot for the purpose of electing the following officers: One person for President, and one person for Vice President of the United States, one person for Judge of the Supreme Court, one person for Representative in Congress, one person for Representative in the General Assembly and one person for County Treasurer.

To vote a straight party ticket, mark a cross (X) in the square, in the first column, opposite the name of the party of your choice. A cross mark in the square opposite the name of any candidate indicates a vote for that candidate. A cross mark in square opposite names of Presidential candidates is a vote for all electors of that party, but for no other candidates.

Notice is hereby given that every person, exceeding justices of the Peace, who shall hold any office or appointment of profit or trust under the Government of the United States, or of this State, or of any city or incorporated district, whether a commissioned officer or otherwise, a subordinate officer or employee of any city or incorporated district, or any other person, who shall hold any office or appointment of profit or trust under the Government of any city or incorporated district, and also that every Member of Congress and of the State Legislature and of the Select or Common Council of any city, or Commissioner of any incorporated district, is by law incapable of holding or exercising at the same time the office or appointment of Judge, Inspector or Clerk of any election of this Commonwealth and that no Inspector, Judge or other officer of any such election shall be given under any hand and seal at any office, in Emporium, Pa., this 24th day of October, A. D., 1904.
