#### Filipinos Who Wish to Vote in this Country Must Take Out Citizenship Papers.

New Haven, Conn., Oct. registrars of voters here Friday twice refused to admit to suffrage J. E. Lagdameo, a Filipino student at the Yale forestry school. The registrars said that as Lagdameo was not native born it was necessary for him to be come naturalized before he could vote. Lagdameo claimed that as the United States owns the Philippines

he was a citizen of this country.

The matter was brought to the at tention of Mayor Studiey, who called up the attorney general's office in Washington. Assistant Attorney General Robb made this statement by telephone: "The supreme court of the United States has held that a Filipino is not a citizen of the United States. Therefore if the law of Con-States. Therefore if the law of Connecticut requires a voter to be a citizen he must be naturalized."
