THE PRESIDENT AT ST. LOUIS.



ROOSEVELT'S ST. LOUIS TRIP. ENTHUSIASTIC GREETINGS GIVEN HIM ALONG LINE OF JOURNEY. VERY FEW SPEECHES WERE MADE.

A Live Coon Was Presented to President Roosevelt at Denison, O.—Every Precaution Will be Taken to Protect Him

Indianapolis, Nov. 26.—After traversing Pennsylvania, West Virginia, Ohio and Indiana, President Roosevelt last night journeyed across Illinois en route to St. Louis, where for two days he and his party will be the guests of the officials of the Louisiana Purchase exposition.

The feature of the journey from Washington to Indianapolis was the enthusiasm with which the president everywhere was received. Every station through which the special train passed was thronged with people anxious even to catch a glimpse of the president.

The most notable demonstration of the day was given the president at Pittsburg. The station where the train stopped for a few minutes was thronged, but only a fractional part of the crowd was permitted on the platform near the train.

To them the president expressed his pleasure at the opportunity afforded him to see them and added: "You may depend upon it, I will do all that in me lies to show you that you made no mistake on November 8."

Throughout the run of the train through the city President Roosevelt remained on the rear platform of his car, bowing and waving his hat to the crowds of people assembled along the railroad track. The windows of factories along the line were filled with faces of workmen who cheered and waved hats and hands as the train swept by.

At Steubenville, O., the station platform was lanked with men, women and children, scores of whom waved American flags.

A live coon was presented to the president at Denison, O., where the train stopped for a few minutes. After the president had greeted the people and as the train was pulling out of the station a man swung the coon over the railing of the car platform and shouted: "Take him, he will bring you good luck."

When the president laughed and shook his head deprecatingly the man again shouted: "You must take him. I'm a life long democrat and I wish you good luck."

Attached to the chain around the animal's neck was a card bearing this inscription: "Compliments of Tuscarawas county, Ohio. Plurality for Roosevelt 2,224, for Bryan in 1900, 613. Presented by O. J. Strope, Denison, Ohio."

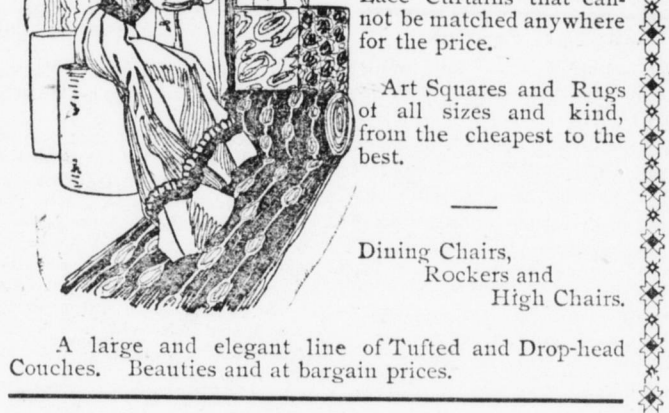
The coon will be taken to Washington and placed in the national zoological park.

When the train pulled into the station at Columbus the president's car was surrounded by a great crowd. The president was cheered heartily as he stepped out on the platform. He spoke as follows: "I want to say what a pleasure it is to me to be traveling through your great state and now to be at its capital. I have enjoyed my trip through the state and perhaps you will pardon my saying it, I enjoyed even more what you did on November 8."
