OFFICIAL CUP OF COFFEE.

Proper Method of Brewing the Beverage to Be Determined in Washington.

Washington. By direction of the secretary of agri-culture the bureau of plant industry is to take up at once experiments to deter-mine the best manner in which to brew a cup of coffee. To this end, says a Wash-ington report, F. L. Lewton, a specially trained expert, has been engaged. The view of the department is that a cup of coffee is good because of the manner in which it is brewed, rather than from the quality of the bean from which the bev-erage is made. It will be appreciated by all persons acquainted with the art and mystery of coffee-making that various con-ditions, apparently trivial in themselves, have to be taken into consideration in producing the beverage. To instance, in the process of roasting the beans may be more or less damaged by being under or over done, and the favor of the coffee thus impaired to a corresponding degree. Hence the necessity for ideal conditions in roasting. MURMURS FROM GROUND.

Strange Sounds Heard for Many Cen turies on the Red Sea

Borders. A singular phenomenon occurs on the borders of the Red sea to a place called Nakous, where intermittent underground sounds have been heard for an unknown number of centuries. It is situated about half a mile distant from the shore, whence a long reach of sand ascends rap-idly to a height of 300 feet. This reach is about 800 feet wide and resembles an am-phitheater, being walled by low rocks. The sounds coming up from the ground at this place recur at intervals of about an hour. They at first resemble a low murmur, but ere long there is heard a loud knocking, somewhat like the strokes of a bell and which at the end of about five minutes becomes so strong as to agi-tate the sand. The explanation of this is that there is a convent under the ground here and that these monks ring for prayers. So they call it Nakous, which means a bell. The Arabs afirm that the noise so fras to render them furious. Philosophers attribute the sound to suppressed volcanic action-probably to the bubbling of gas or vapor underground.

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
