Council Proceedings.
 Regular meeting Borough Council, Emporium, March 6th, 1904.
 Present: Messrs. Julian, Friendle, Catlin, Marshall, LaBar, Butler, Wheaton and Green.
 Messrs. LaBar, Cramer, Butler and Wheaton presented their credentials and were duly recognized as members of Council.
 Mr. Julian was elected temporary chairman.
 Messrs. Marshall and Catlin were placed in nomination for permanent President. The ayes and nays were called and the Councilmen voted as follows:
 For Marshall, Catlin, Green and Wheaton, 3.
 For Catlin, Julian, Friendle, Marshall, LaBar, Cramer and Butler, 6. Mr. Catlin was declared elected.
 Moved by Julian, seconded by LaBar that the salary of Secretary be fixed at \$75 per year. Carried.
 Moved by Friendle, seconded by Marshall that C. J. Goodnough be elected Secretary for the ensuing year. Carried.
 Moved by Butler, seconded by Cramer, that W. F. Lloyd, be elected Treasurer of the Borough and directed to deposit funds in bank in his name as Treasurer. Carried.
 Moved by LaBar, seconded by Butler, that Frank Mundy be elected Street Commissioner and Policeman at a salary of \$50 per month for six months in winter and \$60 per month for six months in summer and that he should trim the electric lights in winter. Carried.
 Moved by Butler, seconded by Cramer that meeting night be fixed on the first Tuesday of each month at 7:30 p. m.
 The order of business of previous Council was carried as the order of business of this Council.
 Minutes of last regular and adjourned meeting read and approved.
 Moved by Julian, seconded by Wheaton, that President and Secretary be instructed to place tax of Sinnamoning Iron & Coal Company in duplicate. Carried.
 Moved by Julian, seconded by Butler that Borough Auditors be requested to render itemized bills for making audit and report for 1903. Carried.
 Moved by Julian seconded by Butler that President and Secretary be instructed to execute a new obligation to Minnie H. Admx. in place of note for one thousand dollars heretofore given to May Holbrook (now deceased) such as in their opinion is proper and satisfactory to the holder of said obligation. Carried.
 Bonds of J. W. Kriner, Poormaster and A. O. Swartwood, High Constable, were approved.
 Moved by Julian, seconded by Butler, that Committee of three be appointed to ascertain if taxes due from C. H. Jessop can be collected and if so to proceed at once to collect the same.
 Messrs. Julian, LaBar and Marshall appointed Committee.
 On motion the Council then adjourned.
