The Pennsylvania State College

Agricultural Experiment Station. The report of the Pennsylvania Sta-

tion for 1903-04 is just being distributed, the printing of it having been seriously delayed. The report contains a full account of the work of the year. As of special interest may be noted the experiments upon the growth of Summatra tobacco under shade, which are quite fully illustrated, the tests of varieties of wheat, oats and potatoes, the experiments upon the use of green forage crops for dairy cows and those upon the value of shelter for fattening cattle. Interesting results were also obtained in the spraying of grapes for black rot. The report of the Director calls special attention to the need of increased funds for the Station work, a need now partially supplied by the action of the Legislature appropriating \$10,000 for two years for the maintenance of the Station.

The report will be sent free of charge to residents of the State, as far as the limited supply available permits.
