REPUBLICAN CONVENTION.

Call for State Convention and Instructions by State Chairman Andrews.

To the Republican Electors of *Pennsylvania:—I am directed by the Republican State Committee to announce that the Republicans of Pennsylvania, by their duly chosen representatives, will meet in convention at the Majestic Theatre in the City of Harrisburg on Wednesday, April 29, 1908, at ten thirty o'clock a. m., for the purpose of nominating candidates for the following offices, to wit:

One person for the office of Judge of the Superior Court.

Thirty-four persons, two at large, for Presidential Electors.

To elect four delegates and four alternates at large to the Republican National Convention to be held in Chicago on June 16, 1908, also for the transaction of such business as may be

presented. In accordance with the rule governing the Republican party in Pennsylvania, the representation in the State Convention will be based on the vote polled at the last Presidential election; under the rules each legislative district is entitled to one delegate for every two thousand votes east for the Presidential electors in 1904, and an additional delegate for every fraction of two thousand votes polled in excess of one thousand.

NATIONAL CONVENTION.

In accordance with the call of the National Committee 68 delegates and 68 alternates are to be chosen in Pennsylvania, for the Republican National Convention, to be held in Chicago, Ill., on Tuesday, June 16, 1908, to wit:

Four delegates and four alternates at large to be elected at the State Convention to be held at Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, April 29th, 1908, and two delegates and two alternates for each of the 32 Congressional districts.

Petitions of candidates in Congress ional districts for delegate and alternate, signed by ten electors as provided by law, must be filed with the Board of County Commissioners not later than Saturday, March 21, 1908, and where a Congressional district is composed of more than one county the candidate must file his petition with the Board of County Commissioners in each county of the district signed by ten petitioners residing in the county where the petition is filed.

Alternate delegates to National Convention shal be placed in nomination. elected and certified in the same manner as delegate is to National Conven-
