VALUE OF CORN COBS .- A friend who had read an article in some paper recommending corn cobs, ground or unground, as an excellent and valuable feed for stock, undertook to test the troth of the statement for himself. He had a large quantity on hand, and after providing himself with the proper vessel, (a half hogshead tub,) he filled it with cobs, and then added a solution of salt in water. In this steep the cobs were suffered to remain till they had imbibed a sufficiency of the fluid to make them soft. In this condition they were then fed out to the stock, at the rate of half a peck to a full-grown cow or ox, in the morning and the same at night. He remarked that all his animals were extremely fond of cobs; that they consumed a much less quantity of grain and hay than before he commenced giving them this feed; neither did they require salt in its natural state. He has also ground several bushels of cobs, and finds the meal an excellent article for making mush. I have used corn and cob meal, ground

with and without oats, for horses, the last twelve or fourteen years, and I think it an excellent feed. It keeps a horse locse in his bowels, his hair lies smooth, and makes a great improvement in his looks. I also used the meal with wheat or out chaff, to feed horses. When I first came to live in the neighborhood, I was ridicaled by the neighbors, who said my horses would all die before spring; but when spring came, they were fatter, and in far Perfumeries and Toilet Articles better condition than theirs. I found that they took my advice after this, and fed the same as myself, making a great saving in feed .- American Agriculturalist.

WOOD ASHES FOR MANURE.-We recommend the farmer carefully to save for use in the spring all the ashes he can collect from the home consumption of fuel during the winter; and, where he has opportunity to procure from other sources a supply, leached or unleached, of this valuable fertilizer. If people knew from experience the worth of this simple manure, there would be no ashes wasted, neither would there be any to sell, except by those who have no soils to improve or no crops to raise. To retain all their virtue, it is highly important that ashes should be kept dry, for water will dissolve a large proportion of the most valuable salts; yet even leached ashes need not be thrown away as of no account; for though far inferior in fertilizing qualities to ulneached ashes, they are by no means useless. One very important result of the employment of this manure in the growth of cereals is the increased strength and luxuriance of straw thereby promoted—a result due to the presence of silicates, on which so much of the straw depends. Other ingredients, essential to both straw and grain, are furnished by this important fertilizer LARGEST. Ashes are valuable also for promoting the growth of grass; and Professor Liebig recommended sowing them broadcast on meadows to increase the hay crop.

A Powerful Fertilizer.—Every farmer has soot at command, whose presence in stove pipes and chimneys is not unfrequently the cause of fires, occasioning the loss sometimes of both property and life. This agent for evil is one of the most valmable manures, and nothing but the most culpable carelessness and indifference will seffer it to remain a standing menace to life and preperty, when it can easily be removed and turned to good account in the garden and field. Twelve quarts of soot in a hogshead of water will make a powerful liquid manure, which will improve the growth of flowers, garden vegetables er root crops. In either a liquid or solid state it makes an excellent top-dressing for grass or cereal crops.

BETTER THAN WHISKY. - The following is a recipe for making ginger beer, a very wholesome and refreshing drink, more healthy and far better than whisky: Put two gallens of cold water into a pot upon a fire; add two ounces of good ginger, bruised, and two pounds of sugar. Let it come to a boil and continue boiling for half an hour. Then skim the liquor, and pour it into a jar or tub, along with one sliced lemon and half an ounce of cream tartar. When nearly cold, put in a cupful of yeast to cause the mixture to ferment. The beer is now made, and after it has worked two days, strain and bottle for use. The down the corks firmly.
