THINGS WORTH KNOWING.

IRON PROTECTION FOR TREES. - An agricultural journal speaks of a peach growcr, who has lost by the ravages of the worms all his peach trees except three, and these three are the most thrifty peach trees he ever saw. The only cause of their salvation known is the nails that were driven into them when they were about a year old. Ten-penny nails were driven in close to the ground. The trees served in this way were selected at random, and now they alme survive the ravages of the insects. It is supposed that the salt of the iron fornished by the mail is offensive to the worm, while it is harmless to the tree. A chemical writer says that the exidation of the iron by the sap evelves ammonia, which, rising from the sap, impregnates every particle of the foliage, and is too severe a dose for the delicate palate of the insects. This is cerdriving half a dozen nails into the trunk. Actilental experiment confirm this result. For example, one branch of an apple tree only bore fruit, and it was found that around that branch had been fastened with a wire a label with the name of the variety and the limb had grown over the wire, thus enclosing and appropriating it and its us s

PRIZE MAM, How CERED. - At a recent Agricultural Fair in Mon'gomery county, a prize was awarded to Nathan White for the best ham. Beat the whole twenty minutes. Then add, by degrees, a quarter of a pound of dried flour. After the floor, beat the whole half an hour. Bake in small fins in a moderate oven, and serve up with brandy sauce.
