ABOUT CARBON OIL .--- To ascertain whether oil is pure and nonexplosive, pour a small quantity upon a board or other smooth surface, and apply a piece of burning paper; if the oil ignites and creates a flame it is adulterated and explosive.---Pure oil will not burn in the open air when thus tested, and its safety may be relied upon. --- Never blow down the chimney of a lamp to put out the flame, because the gas in the lamp occupying the space unfilled by oil is very combustible, and will, under certain circumstances,

To PRESERVE HERBS. -All kinds of herbs should be gathered on a dry day, just before or while in blossom; tie them in bundles and suspend them in a dry, airy place with the blossoms downward. When perfeetly dry wrap the medicinal once in paper and keep them from the air; pick off the leaves of those which are to be used in cooking, pound and sift them fine, and keep the powder in closely corked bot-

CURE FOR FROSTED FLESH .-- NOthing is better for withdrawing the frost, without injury, from frozen ears and cheeks than the immediate application of kerosene, rubbing it on gently a few times. In one instance both cheeks were frozen and this remedy produced immediate relief without the usual inflamation. The same person repeated the application in a similar case at another time, with equal success. In another case the remedy was applied to a badly frozen ear, which, as in the other instance, it cured without inflamation. It is indispensible that the application be made before thawing. This remedy is all the more valuable because it is generally




