ELECTION OF ELECTORS OF A PRESIDENT AND VICE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES.

Pursuant to an Act of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, entitled "An Act relating to the Elections of this Commonwealth," approved the 21st day of July, A. D. 1839, J. JOHN A. BLAIR, High Sheriff of the County of Cambria, in the State of Pennsylvania, do hereby make known and give notice to the electors of the county aforesaid, that a GENERAL ELECTION will be held in said county of Cambria, Pennsylvania, on the 1st Tuesday, 3d day of November, 1868, at which time TWENTY SIX ELECTORS of a President and a Vice President of the United States are to be elected.

I also hereby give notice and make known, that the places of holding the aforesaid General Election in the several Townships and Boroughs within the county of Cambria, are as follows, to wit:

The electors of the district composed of the township of Allegheny, to meet at the office of B. Leary, Esq., in the borough of Loretto.

The electors of the district composed of the township of Cambria, to meet at Court House in borough of Ebensburg.

The electors of the district composed of the township of Carroll, to meet at School House in the borough of Carroll.

The electors of the district composed of the township of Chest, to meet at the School House on the farm of Aloysius Swope, in said twp.

The electors of the district composed of the township of Clearfield, to meet at School House No. 3, in the village of St. Augustine, in said township.

The electors of the district composed of the township of Conemaugh, to meet at the School House in said township.

The electors of the district composed of the township of Croyle, to meet at School House in the village of Summerhill in said township.

The electors of the district composed of the township of East Conemaugh, to meet at the house of Daniel Oester in said borough.

The electors of the district composed of the township of Ebensburg, to meet as follows: East Ward, at the Court House in said Ward; West Ward, at Jas. Myers' Hall in said Ward.

The electors of the district composed of the township of Franklin, to meet at School House in the village of Jackson, to meet at the house of Henry Kager in said township.

The electors of the district composed of the township of Gallitzin, to meet at School House in the town of Gallitzin, in said township.

The electors of the district composed of the township of Johnstown, to meet as follows: First Ward, at the Court House in said Ward; Second Ward, at the office of J. S. Strayer, Esq., on Market st., in said Ward; Third Ward, at Foster House in said Ward; Fourth Ward, at house of John Trevis in said Ward; Fifth Ward, at the office of J. S. Strayer in said Ward; Sixth Ward, at the Johnstown Pottery in said Ward.

The electors of the district composed of the township of Loretto, to meet at School House in said township.

The electors of the district composed of the township of Millville, to meet at the Franklin House in said township.

The electors of the district composed of the township of Munster, to meet at the warehouse of Augustine Durbin in the village of Munster, in said township.

The electors of the district composed of the township of Prospect, to meet at School House in said borough.

The electors of the district composed of the township of Summerville, to meet at the School House in said township.

The electors of the district composed of the township of Taylor, to meet at School House near John Heider's, in said township.

The electors of the district composed of the township of Washington, to meet at the School House at the Foot of Plane No. 4 in said twp.

person who shall have received the next highest number of votes for Judges at the next preceding election, is unable to attend at any place, and in case the person elected shall not attend, then the Inspector who shall have received the highest number of votes shall appoint a Judge in his place, and if he is unable to do so, then the Inspector who shall have received the highest number of votes shall appoint a Judge in his place, and if he is unable to do so, then the Inspector who shall have received the highest number of votes shall appoint a Judge in his place...

In case any Clerk, appointed under the provisions of this Act, shall neglect to attend at any election during the said year, it shall be the duty of the Inspector who appointed said Clerk, or the person filling the place of such Inspector to forthwith appoint a suitable person as clerk, qualified as aforesaid, who shall perform the duties for the year.

"It shall be the duty of the several Assessors, respectively, to attend at the place of holding every general, special or local election, during the whole time said election is kept open, for the purpose of giving information to the Inspector, and the Judge when called on, in the relation to the right of any person to be admitted to vote at such election, or such other matters in relation to the assessment of votes as the said Inspectors, or either of them, shall from time to time require."

No person shall be permitted to vote whose name is not contained in the list of taxable inhabitants furnished by the Commissioners, unless first he produce a receipt for the payment of a State or county tax, or a receipt for the Constitution, and give satisfactory evidence, either on his own oath or affirmation or that of another, that he has paid such tax, or on failure to produce a receipt for the same shall be deemed to be in default of the same, and shall be liable to be fined by the Inspectors, or either of them, for each and every violation of this Act, and shall be liable to be fined by the Inspectors, or either of them, for each and every violation of this Act, and shall be liable to be fined by the Inspectors, or either of them, for each and every violation of this Act...

In all cases where the name of a person claiming to vote is found on a list of voters compiled by the Commissioners and Assessors, or his right to vote, whether found thereon or not, is objected to by any qualified elector, it shall be the duty of the Inspectors to examine such person on oath as to his qualifications, and if he has resided in the State one year or more, his oath shall be sufficient proof thereof, but he shall make proof by at least one competent witness, that he has resided in the district for more than ten days next preceding said election, and shall also himself swear that his bona fide residence, in practice of his trade or profession, is within the district, and that he did not receive into said district for the purpose of voting therein...

Every person qualified as aforesaid, and who shall make the proof, as is required, of his residence and bona fide residence, as aforesaid, shall be admitted to vote in the township, ward or district in which he shall reside.

If any person shall prevent, or attempt to prevent, any other person from exercising his right to vote at any election, or use or threaten any violence to any such officer, or shall block up the window, or avenue to any window, where the same may be holding, or shall riotously disturb the peace, or shall threaten, or shall use or practice any intimidating threats, force or violence, with design to influence unduly or overawe any elector, or to prevent him from voting, or to restrain the free choice of choice, such persons, on conviction, shall be fined in any sum not exceeding \$500 and be imprisoned for any time not less than one month, and in default of payment of such fine, shall be committed to the County Jail, and if such offense shall be had, that the person so offending was not a resident of the city, ward, district or township where the said offense was committed, he shall be liable to be fined, then, on conviction, he shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than one hundred nor more than one thousand dollars, and be imprisoned not less than six months nor more than two years.

That the qualified voters of the several counties of this Commonwealth, at all general, township, borough or school district elections, hereby, hereafter, authorized and required to vote by tickets, printed or written, or partly printed and partly written, severally classified as follows: One ticket shall embrace the names of all Judges of courts voted for, and be labelled, "Judicial"; one ticket shall embrace the names of all State officers voted for, and be labelled "State"; one ticket shall embrace all county officers, including the office of Senator, member or members of Assembly, if voted for, and members of Congress, if voted for, and be labelled "County"; one ticket shall embrace the names of all township officers voted for, and be labelled "Township"; one ticket shall embrace the names of all borough officers voted for, and be labelled "Borough"; and each class shall be deposited in separate ballot boxes.

Pursuant to the provisions contained in the Act first aforesaid, the Judges of the aforesaid districts shall respectively take charge of the certificate or return of their respective districts, and produce them at a meeting of one Judge from each district, at the Court House in the borough of Ebensburg, on the third day after the day of election, being FRIDAY, 21st INST. MAY OR CREDIT, 1868, and then attend there to do and perform the duties required of them by law.

And further, if any Judge, or witness or unavoidable absence, is unable to attend said meeting of Judges, then the certificate or return aforesaid shall be taken charge of by one of the Inspectors or Clerks of the election of the same district, who shall do and perform the duties of said Judge until he is able to attend.
