ELECTION OF ELECTORS PRESIDENT AND VICE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES.

Pursuant to an Act of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, entitled "An Act relating to the Elections of this Commonwealth," approved the 21st day of July, A. D. 1845, JOHN A. BLAIR, High Sheriff of the County of Cambria, in the State of Pennsylvania, do hereby make known and give notice to the electors of the county aforesaid, that a GENERAL ELECTION will be held in said county of Cambria, Pennsylvania, on the 1st Tuesday, 3d day of November, 1868, at which time FIFTY SIX ELECTORS of a President and a Vice President of the United States are to be elected.

person who shall have received the next highest number of votes for Judge of the next preceding election, shall act as Inspector in his place. And in case the person so appointed be unable to perform the duties of the office, the highest number of votes for Inspector shall not attend, the person elected Judge shall appoint an Inspector in his place, and in case the person elected Judge shall not appoint an Inspector, the highest number of votes shall appoint a Judge in his place, and if any vacancy shall continue in the board for the space of one hour after the time set for the opening of the election, the qualified voters of the township, ward or district, for which such officers have been elected, present at the place of election, shall elect some of their number to fill the vacancy.
