In another vessel dissolve in brandy as much i-inglass, previously softened in water, as will make a two ounce phial of strong glue, adding two bits of gum ammoniac, which must be rubbed until dissolved. Then mix the whole with heat .--When it is to be used set the phial in boiling water.
