For a sprain, the best remedy to use is alcohol and beef's gall, putting one gall into a pint of alcohol, and keeping it for the purpose. Tincture of arnica, universally used for sprains, &c., is believed by him to be weakening to the system (being very penetrating in its nature) and is wholly discarded.
