OUR OLDEST FORTRESS .- Under this title, "Old and New," for September, gives a minute chronological history of Fort Independence (now so called) in Boston Harbor, originally built on Castle Island in 1634. The following extract recalls one of the instances when the fort Illy was of historic importance :

In 1765, "the Castle" begins to appear as the one place where the English crown was sure of its authority.

The stamps, by which a revenue was intended to be raised from the British colonies, arrived in the habor of Boston in September, 1765, and were lodged for opposition in America to this stamp-act, having prevented its being in any instance carried into execution, soon procured its repeal.
