THE ISLAND OF CAPRI. - In the island of Capri theft is unknown; two murders are mentioned as having formerly taken place; but the peaceful and industrious habits of the people keep them from violent crimes. Each knows the other by name—life has no secresy; a bad man would soon be discovered, unmasked, and obliged to leave the island. The greater number of the inhabitants have never been on the mainland .-Any one coming from Naples astonishes his simpler neighbors by description of carriages drawn by horses, there being neither cart nor vehicle of any kind in Capri; as the roads are nothing more than staircases, they would not admit of them. The popular ignorance is great; there is a school in each of the towns, but only one master, who divides his days between them; and at eight years of age the children are sent to assist at the fishing, or to gather mulberry leaves for the silk-worms, or grapes from the vines. Any notice of Capri would be incomplete

without a word about the Blue Grotto. The entrench from the sea is so narrow, that the person in the boat must lie down; but as soon as that is passed you enter into fairyland. The water, clear to the bottom, is of an exquisite celestial blue, which is reflected from the calcareous rocks in their pure whiteness. It is a place of torquoise, built above a sapphire lake. The drops of water from the oars sparkle like pearls with a blue tinge. The effect upon the body is most singular; the part under water of a swim-mer is silvery white, with blue shadows around the muscles; whilst the head and neck, which are out of the water, are of a bronze color, looking like an alabaster statue with a bronze head. It is certainly one of the most beautiful natural curiosities in the world. A fisherman was first to discover it in 1722, though there are some indications that it was known to the ancients. Much has been written as to the cause of so singular a phenomenon; perhaps the most plausible is, that owing to the peculiar form of the entrance, the sea is saturated with light, which is shut up within, and throws its rays to the farthest depths of the vauit. In another part of the coast, there is a grotto the color is that of pale green; it is very similar to its neighbor, but not quite equal

A STRANGE ANIMAL IN COLORADO. - That there exists in the mountains of Colorado beasts and animals unknown to the devotees of science, there cannot be the slightest doubt. We have just learned from a trapper on the Greenhorn, a stream about twenty miles south of Puebla, who, while hunting elk and deer, saw a strange animal, at the right of which he was not only astonished but at first it caused him great fear. The hunter was, however, in a position that afforded him protection, and after the first surprise and he had gained an assurance of his safety, he watched the beast, and the following is a description of the thing: It was larger than an ox, and of a kind of mouse color, with a skin varied with light stripes, similar to those of a zebra. Its head favored that of a rhinoceros, but much larger, and a bushy tail like that of a fox. The animal fed on grass, weeds, etc., and finally disappeared, crossing the creek, and up the mountains, where it is likely the brute has a habitation of some kind. The next day our informant examined the tracks of this singular looking animal, and found them to be like those of a horse, but a great deal larger. We cannot but believe the assertion of the trapper to be entirely true, as the whole story is fully corroborated by Mr. Matt. Riddle, barger, who lives in that beast or one like it. We think that by the next issue of our paper we will be able to give more authentic information on this matter, as we learn that a party of gentlemen are now in pursuit of this seeming monstrosity, and are determined to capture the animal, and thus give to the world and science another proof that there are still strange animals in existence which, although scarce. are not entirely extinct .- Puebla (Cal.) Chieftain.

BLEEDING FROM THE NOSE .- A CO-respondent writes the flowing: Two years ago ago while going down Broadway, blood commenced running from my nose quite freely. I stepped aside and applied my handkerchief, intending to repair to the nearest hotel, when a gentleman accosted me saying : "Just put a piece of paper in your mouth, chew it rapidly, and it will stop your nose bleeding." Thanking him rather doubtfully, I did as he suggested, and the flow of blood ceased almost immediately. I have seen the remedy tried since quite frequently, and always with success. Doubtless any substance would answer the same purpose as paper, the stoppage of the flow of blood being caused doubtless by the rapid motion of the jaws, and the counter action of the muscles and arteries connecting the jaws and nose.

Physicians say that placing a small piece of paper or muslin above the front teeth, under the upper lip, and pressing hard on the same, will arrest bleeding from the nose, checking the passage of the blood through the arteries leading to the nose.
