Dear Freeman-I thought 1 would send these items at the risk even of their being too late for insertion : A brakeman on the shifting train at the

lower shops, who gave his name as John McCoy, and who has been in the employ of the Pa. R. R. Co, for several months, slipped and fell from his train while it was in motion, on Friday last, and two heavily hulened cars passed over his body, completely cut-ting him in two. Finding that persuasion was fruitless, Mr. Jones, like a good Samaritan, took him in his own sled, and after covering him up carefully and comfortably, conveyed him to his home in Allegheny township, where he died sho t y after. The immediate cause of his death can only be accounted for by the fact that he was attacked by a severe fit of vomiting after reaching home, and the presumption is that a portion of the cheese which he had been eating while in this place, and of which he is said to have been very fond, lodged in his throat and produced sufficiation ending in death. A p'rysician was called as soon as possible after Mr. Kaylor was taken to his ome, but all efforts to avert his fate proved futile.
