EARTHQUAKE, VOLCANIC ERUPTIONS, FLOODS AND PESTILENCE.

On January 4, 1872, there were violent 1572. J thunder storms, with shock of earthquakes, in England; 16th, the great earthquake at To anici Shemacha, Caucasus, occurred, killing 137 people, wounding 44, and destroying the To amon Northern Pacific Railroad. The latter part of January and the beginning of February were extremely cold and many persons in the Northwest died from exposure. Feb-mary S, three persons were killed in Utah To amon by enarmous snow slides 2,000 feet in height; TICK. the 14th, a flightful storm in the Northwest, To amo the 14th, a high function in the Forthwest, soo cars blockaded, and many persons re-ported as perishing from cold. March, 30 show-drifts were reported in Nova Scotia thirty feet deep ; 26th and following days, Tax c several shocks of earthquake were felt in To amot California; 1,560 miles of country were shaken, 40 people killled, and 100 wounded. To amou Oaxaca, Mexico, was visited by an earthquake, by which 2,00 persons were killed. To amon An eruption of Vesuvious-the most terrible for two centuries-occurred on the 25th to To amo 27th causing the death of 200 persons ----June 8, a great tornado occurred in Ohio, To amon by with 160 houses were blown down and To amon (0 persons more or less injured. The Summer in the Northern States was characterized by the intense heat which occurred at short intervals and continued long. The first snow fell at Blandford, Mass., on the By amou 31st of August. September 28, Osceola Ark., was nearly destroyed by a burricane, and the following day there were great gales and immense loss of property on the Lakes. October 24, disastrous freshets on the river Po, in Italy, rendered 69,00 fami-lies homeless. On November 13 and 14, terrible gales in the Baltic and North seas; eighty ships and hundreds of lives reported 1 st; the damage between \$2,000,000 and By amo \$3,000,000; 20th, great gales on the English coast, causing great damage ; Decem-Ler 4, Po again flooded ; 8th to 19th, hurricane in England and Ireland : towns gooded and 449 lives reported lost in ten days; 19th, the Seine overflowed and Paris was partly under water ; 22d, the greatest inundation of the Thames in twenty years occurred at London; 26th, great snow storm in New York; travel almost stopped. The following days the storm continued in the West.

January 1 to 8, 140 persons died of small pox in Philadelphia; small pox reported as spreading in all parts of England, Ire-land, and Scotland. March 22, small pox in New York and vicinity. April 5, 43 persons reported as dying in a week of small pox in Montreal. June 11, cholera appears in Southern Russia. Week ending July 6, 1,569 persons died from the offects of the terrible heat in New York; 10th, rinderpest attacks the herds of England; 20th choicra spreading in Central and Southern Russia. August 20th, cholera in India and West Russia. September 17th, fatal cattle plague appears in Nevada. October 1st, the great horse plague appears in Ontario, Canada, and in the two months following is said to have attacked 5,000,000 horses: 10th, 3,000,-000 of persons said to have died of famine and plague in Persia ; 25th, 20,000 horses sick of the epizootic in New York-the following days witnessed a great mortality among the sick ones; 30th, cholera appears
