AGRICULTURAL.

A NEW PROCESS OF BUTTER MAKING.—About fifteen years ago a plan for manufacturing cheese on a large scale was inaugurated in Ohio. Its general features were as follows:—The milk was converted into curds at the farm dairies in the usual manner, and then each dairyman took the fresh curds to a central factory, where they were weighed and credited at a certain rate per pound.

DRILLING VS. BROADCAST SEEDING.—The Department of Agriculture has summarized the facts received from its correspondents relative to drilling or broadcast seeding wheat: 1. Fifty-two per cent. of the winter wheat and 30 per cent. of the spring wheat, or about 40 per cent. of the aggregate of both kinds, represent the proportion seeded with a drill.
