## General Election PROCLAMATION.

HERMAN BAKER, and other State Officers of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, do hereby make known and give notice to the electors of this Commonwealth, that a General Election will be held on the second Tuesday of November, A. D. 1874, (the same being the Tuesday next following the first Monday in November,) and that the County officers will be elected as follows:

ONE PERSON for the office of Lieutenant Governor of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

ONE PERSON for the office of Auditor General of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

ONE PERSON, in conjunction with the counties of Berks, Bedford and Somerset, for the office of Representative in the Congress of the United States.

TWO PERSONS for the offices of Members of the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

ONE PERSON for the office of Prothonotary of Cambria county.

ONE PERSON for the office of District Attorney of Cambria county.

TWO PERSONS for the offices of County Commissioners of Cambria county, to serve for the term of three years.

ONE PERSON for the office of Poor House Director of Cambria county.

TWO PERSONS for the offices of Auditors of Cambria county, to serve for the term of three years.

ONE PERSON for the office of Coroner of Cambria county.
