Nor the least gratifying result of Tuesday's elections is the ascertained fact that Ben Butler has been defeated for Congress by Republican votes in Massachusetts, and that such men as Chamberlain and Siphers, of South Carolina, have been laid out completely by negro votes.

The indications are that the Democrats have elected a majority of the members of the House, and decreased the Republican majority in the Senate.

The Philadelphia delegation will probably stand 27 Republicans to 11 Democrats—which is a gain for the latter.

THE GENERAL RESULT.
