IT is a well known historical fact that the Catholic colony of Maryland was the first to establish perfect religious freedom in the new world. Few, however, of our readers, we presume, have ever read the celebrated Maryland statute proclaiming this great and inestimable right now enjoyed by the whole American people. It was enacted in 1654, only fourteen years after the pilgrims landed at Plymouth rock. and is in the following brief and comprehensive language: "No person within this province professing to believe in Jesus Christ shall be in any deay troubled, molested or discountenanced for his or her religion, or in the free exercise thereof."

-----THE following is one of the innumerable dark ways by which the hard earned taxes of the people of a large city are literally stolen from their treasury. Wm. J. Murtagh, editor of the National Republican (Washington) last June published an advertisement of the tax sales of that city, for which he was paid fifty thousand dollars by the District Commissioners. One would suppose that this steal would have satisfied even Murtagh. But it did not, and he has now brought suit against the Commissioners to recover a small balance of forty-seven thousand dollars, which he claims to be due him for the same work. We would not be sarprised if he gets it, thus making \$97,000 for publishing the tax sales of Washington city alone. If this is not robbery, unblushing and wholesale, we know not by what other name it deserves to be designated.
