A RARE OLD PLANT.—Dickens' ap- preciation of the virtues of the "Ivy Green" could not have been greater than the estimate made daily by those who visit the Horticultural Hall on the Centennial grounds, of the beautiful rarities in natural growth which are there to be seen. The great date- palm tree from Bermuda is the greatest attraction in the department. Its height is thirteen feet, and many branches spring from its juicy trunk. It was at one time the property of Mr. James Edgar Thompson, of Greenville, Miss., and was sold by him to William Raven, of Charleston, in 1854, who was an eminent florist of the South just prior to the war. When South Carolina seceded Raven disposed of his stock and quit the country.—Among the articles of his personal property was the date-palm. It (the tree) was purchased by Mr. Ralph Eldeberg, of New Orleans, to which place it was transplanted in front of its owner's private residence. In this, its last resting-place, it flourished remarkably well, and became a notice- able branch of the foliage of the Cres- cent City. During the lifetime of Mr. Eldeberg it was ascertained that the tree came originally from Bermuda, and was then, in 1855, at least fifty- four years of age. The latter fact be- came known after Mr. Thompson's death, when the Greenville Register, in publishing an interesting account of his life, declared that the tree had been purchased by his father during a so- journ in Bermuda, and that the singu- larity of the plant would make for it a history of longevity and usefulness. In the account which is given of the tree's extraordinary life it is said that behind it, Mrs. Gaines, the cele- brated brigant for the entire territory covered by New Orleans, once sheltered her life from assassin's bullets. That the tree has undergone more frequent transplanting than any other of its class seems indisputable, and that in its history, interesting indeed were it but told by one who could have witnessed the vicissitudes of its more than half- century of life, there would be an un- rivaled chapter in the story of Ameri- can horticulture well worthy the natu- ral interest which is centered in the Centennial year.
