Items Relating to Corn.

It was stated in New Hampshire agricultural society that a bushel of corn had been found to produce 9 pounds live weight of poultry...

At Urbana, Ill., a single kernel of corn produced 8 ears that shelled over 2,000 grains.

The late Joseph Pat, of New Jersey, was frequently known to produce single ears that shelled a quart of grain...

In the competition of Elmira year before last for the Wilson premium, Mr. Van Sickle, of Cayuga county, N. Y., produced 4 1/2 ounces of corn from a single kernel.

The largest yield of corn on record for an entire acre was obtained by Dr. Parker, of South Carolina, and measured over 200 bushels of shelled grain.

If that crop had been all replanted at the rate of one peck of seed per acre, it would have covered 800 acres, and if the yield had been at the same rate as the first the crop would have amounted to 160,000 bushels of grain and 14,000,000 pounds of stalk.

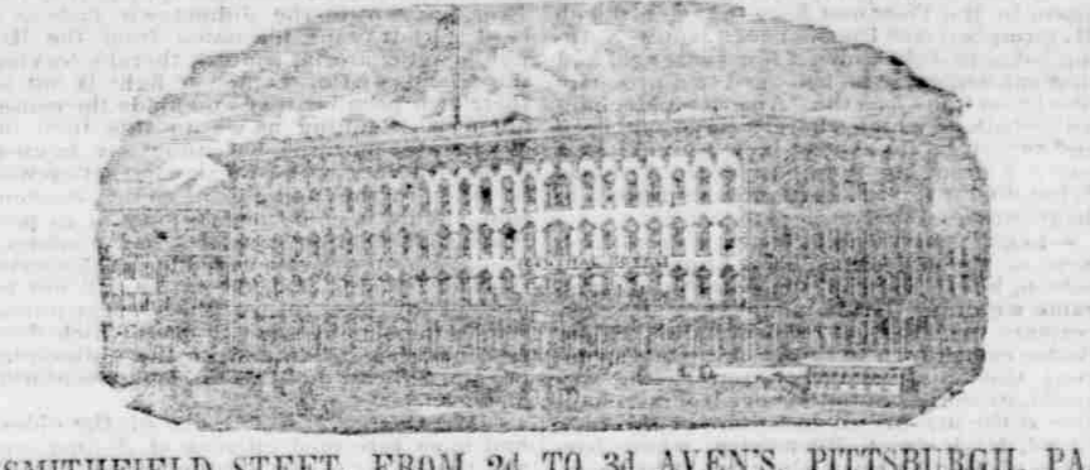
