

Democratic Primary Election Rules of Clearfield County.

1. The organization of the County Committee shall be and remain now constituted...

2. The number of delegates to which each district is entitled is based upon the following ratio...

3. The delegate elections and County Convention shall be held on the following date...

4. The election for delegates to represent the different districts in the annual Democratic County Convention shall be held...

5. In case any of the persons so constituting the board shall be absent from the election...

6. Every qualified voter of the district who at the last general election voted the Democratic ticket, shall be entitled to a vote at the election...

7. The voting at all delegate elections shall be by ballot, open which ballots shall be written or printed in the name of the delegate...

8. No instructions shall be received or returned to the delegates...

9. Each election board shall keep in record the names of all persons who vote at such elections...

10. Whenever from any district, qualified Democratic voters, in numbers equal to five times as many as the total number of voters in the County Convention...

11. All delegates must reside in the district they represent. In case of the inability of a delegate...

12. Delegates must obey the instructions given them by their respective districts...

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14. If any person who is a candidate for any office shall be nominated by the County Convention...

15. If any delegate shall receive any money from any person...

16. Any delegate who is a candidate for any office shall be notified by the County Convention...

17. The County Convention shall meet on the 10th day of June...
