CATCHING COLD—REMEDIES.

While it is easy to take cold in midwinter, and colds are usually most prevalent when low temperature prevails, though less in clear, steady winter than during the variable spring and autumn.

The causes of a cold, named indicate how to avoid one. Maintaining general health by means of a regular diet, or to resist an attack. When to be especially exposed, a little tonic, such as a grain of two of quinine, taken in advance.

Simple remedies will usually remove a cold, if taken promptly, before the congestion has produced serious disorders. When an attack with a sense of chilliness, 15 to 30 grains of Arsenic, or Spirits of Ammonia, in half a tumbler of water, will often start a uniform circulation all through the body.

The best remedy we have found for a recent cold is a moderate movement of the bowels with castor oil, or castor oil with mineral magnesia. This produces a flow of blood, drives out the blood to the alimentary canal, and thus reduces the pressure upon any one congested point.
