SIMPLE REMEDY FOR CATARRH AND BRONCHITIS.
It is now generally known that carbolic acid is strongly disinfectant, and very useful when applied to purulent sores or purulent wounds. Wood creosote is similar, is decidedly antiseptic, and quite volatile. It is therefore natural to suppose it is useful when applied to catarrhal and bronchial affections which arise from disease of purulent origin. We learned of its use for this purpose from Dr. Prescott, a leading physician in the noted Italian Medical school in Genoa, from whose conversations we gleaned the following important article on "Catching Cold and the Remedies," given in last December's American Agriculturist. We have since recommended the following statement in many cases with the best results. It can do no harm, is simple, and eminently worthy of a trial, both for temporary and chronic affections.

For Bronchitis.—Get from the druggist a little good creosote. Put two drops of it into a bottle holding a pint or so. Pour in a little more than half a pint of clear water and shake it well. Also add a little more creosote. Take a mouthful of this, throw the head back, gargle it sometime in the throat and then swallow it. Repeat this every two hours, more or less, so as to use up the liquid creosote in four or five days. Each subsequent 24 hours, use three drops of the creosote in 3 or 4 gills of water. This three drops a day may be continued as long as any bronchitis appears. For four days it is useful enough, though it may be continued indefinitely without harm.

For Catarrh.—Prepare the creosote water as above, in any amount, at the rate of one drop to one gill of water (4 drops to the pint), or if it is more water if the creosote be very strong and the water too irritating. Make a fresh mixture once in two or three days, and use it as often as it is needed. Take a handful of this water, previously well shaken, and sniff it through the mouth, and if need be, occasionally during the day. In fact, keep the nasal passages washed out with the creosote water. Its vapors will even penetrate the bony cavities, and also be drawn into the lungs with useful results. It destroys the purulent mucus, and tends to prevent its further formation. It is useful in any discharges from the nose or lungs produced by colds or general weakness.

For bronchitis, and especially for catarrh, good rare cooked beef and other nourishing food, and quinine if needed, to obtain and retain a vigorous system, are capital aids to the creosote or any other medicine. To insure accuracy, as usual in such cases we sent a proof-slip of the above to a very competent regular physician, who returned it without correction or addition, except as follows: "The above is valuable and entirely reliable, and should be widely read. Nine-tenths of the people who take nostrums for catarrh have no such disease, but have been made to believe they suffer from it by the quacks who sell their useless and poisonous stuffs at an immense profit. A common cold is an acute catarrh, and properly treated is soon well. Chronic catarrh of any part of the mucous tract is not so easily cured, but fortunately is much more rarely seen by physician even than people usually think."—Orange Judd in American Agriculturist.

CLIPPING FOR THE CURIOUS.—The word "coldman" is derived from the Saxo- "coldman." Butter was used by the early Romans as medicine, never as food. IMPROVEMENT OF HORSES.—A. B. Allen, writing to the Chicago National Live Stock Journal says: "Instead of the farmers throughout our country instead of breeding annually so many inferior horses, which they are obliged to sell at a price that scarcely pays for their rearing, if they would rear a little more pains in the selection of the parents, they might be able to produce them of so superior a kind as to bring double the amount they now generally sell for, at three years of age and older. In breeding for the general purpose horse, after securing the proper size and figure, the endeavor should be to get those which draw a free and easy natural walk of four and a half to five miles per hour, and trot of seven to eight. Such animals would be much more useful than those which can be driven at a three or four minute gait for a single mile, but whose ordinary pace is less than those spoken of above; and the former would work out and out-travel the latter considerably in a succession of days. Horses of this kind may be bred powerful enough to do all but the heaviest plowing on the farm in stiff soil, and wagging in muddy roads, and sufficiently elegant for the gentleman's carriage. Thus they would be highly useful to the farmer as well as to the wish to keep them, and could then be sold at a round sum to the wealthy residents of towns and cities.

REMEDY FOR THE MAGGOT OR CABBAGE FLY.—Mr. H. M. Wood, Hartford county, Ct., writes: "I see by an article in the December number of the American Agriculturist that bisulphide of carbon is recommended for the cabbage fly. How is it applied? The use of bisulphide of carbon is not only to be recommended for the cabbage-maggot, but also for the squash-borer, and other subterranean insects. It would serve admirably to destroy any insects we find their hills. To apply the liquid we have only to make a small hole, close beside the plant, to the depth of two or three inches, with a cane or other small rod, then pour into the hole a half teacupful of the fluid, and quickly cover the same by filling the hole with earth, and pressing it down with the foot. The same operation is to be made in the hill which will quickly destroy the ants if they are in the galleries of the hill. All should remember that bisulphide of carbon and also its vapor, are very inflammable, and when ordinary care is used with great care.—American Agriculturist.
