For Bronchitis .-- Get from the druggist's a little good wood creosote. Put two drops of it into a bottle holding a pint or so. Pour in a little more than half a pint of clear water and shake it well ; also shake it well before using it Take a mouthful of this, throw the head back, gurgle it sometime in the throat and then swallow it. Repeat this every two hours, more or less, so as to use up the liquid within 24 hours. For each subsequent 24 hours, use three drops of the creosote in 3 or 4 gills of water. This three drops a day may be continued as long as any bronchitis appears. though it may be continued indefinitely




