The bill fixing the compensation of witnesses in civil and criminal cases before Aldermen and Justices of the Peace which passed the Legislature near the close of the session, was signed by Governor Pattison last week.

It will be seen from the call of the Chairman of the Democratic Committee which is published elsewhere that the members of the Committee are requested to meet at Armory hall, in this place, on Monday next.

The Philadelphia Progress edited by a son of the late John W. Forney, tells Republican officeholders what they ought to do, and on their failure to heed the admonition suggests the proper remedy to Mr. Cleveland, as follows:

The bill fixing the salary of the members of the Legislature at \$1,500 for the regular session without regard to its length, and \$500 for a special session, and also fixing the compensation of the employees of the two houses, passed the Legislature at the heels of the session and has since been signed by the Governor.

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A BILL OF HISTORY.
