A SUNDAY IN NEW ORLEANS.

There were three services in the Cathedral. We had determined to attend the last as the most impressive and edifying.

On entering the church we found it not crowded as we had expected. We afterwards learned that the members in the warm season always attended the early services.

The church was not more than half filled; and those in attendance, at least one-half seemed drawn there by motives of curiosity.

They were in themselves, intent on slight social and other duties, and the cathedral was, with these, one of the sights.

I need not say here what is known to every intelligent Protestant and Catholic, and the Catholic service is the same in every part of the habitable globe.

But outside of the service the preaching was in the French language, and a pastoral address, in French to the really serious and earnest, was not so sorry when the services closed.

We could not fail to notice, nearly all Northerners and Protestants while inattentive to the solemn services of the mass, listened with the ears of curiosity to the sacred tone of the deep-voiced organ, and the highly cultivated voices had expected.

Just as services closed we met Gen. Koon's and Counselor Dhl. of Somerset. And the sacred edifice in which we met did not prevent the warm greetings of old friends, meeting thousands of miles away from our several homes.

Their four had been the same as ours, and in different direction, and on separate paths crossed in the N. O. cathedral.

In the early afternoon we partook of the most elaborate dinner I have ever enjoyed; and after spending an hour at table, enjoying an excellent cigar and a short sleep, left the city at six o'clock.

I sat on the piazza conversing with a party of New England savans, about our respective travels. In reply to an inquiry, I stated that I had come by the Louisville route.
