rists. Indeed, that flower is soarce at the greenhouses. According to a report of a Dakota FRIDAYmer, his field of barley grew thirtyght inches in thirty eight days or at primore rate of an inch a day.

pay ? Evergreens should be so placed and mingled with deciduous trees that when the leaves of the latter fall the others may, as it were, take their place to cheer the winter scenes. This may be accomplished without crowding either.

A willow farm in Macon, Ga., produces about a ton of switches to the acre, commanding, when dried, \$200, and as the leaves and bark sell at twenty-five cents a pound, baled, the enterprise pays better than cotton.

Before slaughtering an animal withhold all food from it for twenty-four hours, but allow it all the water it will drink. This course empties intestines. facilitates the cleaning of the carcass and lessens the possibility of contamipation of the meat.

Earth worms in pots will generally succumb under liberal doses of lime and tobacco water. A florist also used successfully ten drops of carbolic acid in a pint of water. Poured upon the earth, the worms are killed and the plants im-

To prevent a spread of chicken chotera, Dr. Salmon recommends a mixture of two ounces of sulphuric acid and two gallons of water. This will destroy every germ of the cholera that it touches and is one of the best disinfectants known.

The rice crop of the United States is said to average 400,000 to 500,000 barrels. It is divided among the States about as follows: North Carolina, 30,-000 barrels: South Carolina, 100,000; Georgia, 80,000; Louisiana, 200,000. 1t is also growp in Florida, Mississippi, Alabama and Texas.

Plants are drawn out of the earth in winter by successive freezing and thawing. Freezing contracts and thawing expands the earth. The plants are raised up in thawing and settling down again. Thus even plants, if not set below the action of frosts, will eventually be thrown out. A covering of muck prevents surface thawing, and thus protects the plants.

There is no more pleasurable way of spending an evening on the farm, than in the study of some subject of natural history connected with the farm work. There is an extensive variety of subjects to choose from, and all are of such interest that there can be no difficulty in making a selection. Moreover, as a method of cultivating social intercourse these subjects may be studied and discussed among a few friends, invited for the purpose, who should come prepared to take part in the conversation.

An impression prevails among farmers that briers enrich the ground on which they grow, and for this reason they are allowed to spring up in pastures and old corners on many farms. An old brier patch is rich because every leaf or blade of grass that the wind carried into them is held there, and the grass and weeds that grow there, being where stock cannot get at them, fall down where they grow, and in course of time the soil naturally gets rich and the farmer becomes poor through paying taxes on land that he gets nothing

The yield of the Florida orange crop will be very near 900,000 boxes. The boxes will average 195 to 170 orangesthat is, standard boxes. Last season the standard box held 180, the year previous only about 160. There is less rust than ever known before. The fruit is larger, brighter and smoother than last year. As to price, the grower will get from \$1.75 to \$2 per box.

Gather the nuts fresh and sound Select some place out of the way and take up a sod, drop the nut in its place, then put the sod back inverted and press it down. Leave until planting time in the spring when most of the nuts will be sprouted or started to sprout, Walnuts and chestnuts should be planted where intended to stand. Cultivation and protection are necessary.

DOG-BITTEN CHILDREN.

Dr. Pastuer's Remedy for Hydrophobia.

An amount nearly sufficient to send to Paris the children who were bitten by a mad dog at Newark, N. J., last week has been raised, and the children will sail on Wednesday, on the steamer Canada, Dr. Pastuer, in whose care the children will be placed, believes that he has discovered an antidote for hydrophobia, but it must be used before the disease develops itself. He begun his experiments in 1882. He took a portion of the spinal cord of dog that had died of hydrophobis, and with that he inoculated a rabbit in the first membrane of the brain. It went mad in fifteen days, Then with a portion of the spinal cord of this rabbit he inoculated another rabbit in the same way, and it went mad in thirteen days, and so on. He continued inoculations from rabbit to rabbit, finding the strength of the virus increase each time, until the ninetieth time produced hydrophobia in only seven days. He then took very small portions of the spinal cord of his ninetieth rabbit, and which contained the greatest virulence yet obtained, and suspended these bits of virus in empty bottles, in which the sir was kept extremely dry by means of potash in the bottom of the bottle. After several days' exposure in a dry. cold temperature the virus loses all its strength. 


