THE MEXICAN PENSION BILL.

The Senate's Amendments of a Very Loose and Sweeping Piece of House Legislation.

WASHINGTON, July 13. The Mexican Pension bill, as amended by the House on the 5th of April, under a suspension of the rules, by a vote of two to one and nearly twenty years ago, was so considered by the Senate.

As passed by the House, Mr. Wolford's bill granted life pensions at the rate of \$500 per annum to all officers, soldiers, and sailors who enlisted and served in the war with Mexico from 1847 to 1848, and were honorably discharged.
