Price and growth of the city of London is shown by the mileage of the streets. Should they be placed together they would measure about 2,600 miles, or nearly the distance across the Atlantic ocean.

An experimental sidewalk is now in operation in Chicago. It consists of two movable platforms 300 feet long, moving side by side in the same direction, one at a speed of three, the other at six miles per hour. It has carried 500 persons at one time and seems to be a success. It will be used at the World's Fair.

SECRETARY BLAINE was suddenly prostrated with an attack of illness at his office in the State Department, in Washington, on Wednesday morning about 11 o'clock. The illness was caused by indigestion, and after receiving medical attention he was taken to his home in a carriage, where the latest reports say he is now fully recovered.

THE STATE TREASURER'S monthly report shows \$782,700.25 in the sinking fund and \$5,380,671.17 in the general fund. It is out of this latter fund that the schools will receive the annual appropriation of \$5,000,000. In June. After that date the general fund is not expected to be very large, except just before the school payment is made each year.

ON SATURDAY General Montgomery C. Meigs, a retired member of the United States Engineer Corps, died of grip at Washington, D. C. He was regarded as the foremost scientific soldier in this country. He received the rank of major general in 1862. He was in the Army throughout the entire war of the rebellion. He was born in Augusta, Ga., in 1816.

STATE SUPERINTENDENT of Banking Knudman has submitted to the Attorney General a report on the condition of the Continental Finance and Trust Company of Philadelphia. The report gives no figures, but states that the keeping was very defective, and that the concern is insolvent, and asks that the Attorney General apply for a receiver for the company.

AT A VERY bitter fight between Senator Sherman and ex-Governor Foraker, of Ohio, for the Senatorship, Sherman succeeded in obtaining Foraker on Wednesday by a vote of 55 to 28. It makes but little difference to Democrats whether Sherman or Foraker is preferred by the Republicans but it is a satisfaction to know that that blatant demagogue Fire-Alarm Foraker will not be heard of in the Senate for some time to come.

SPEAKER CRISP has been very ill for the past couple of weeks and is unable to preside in Congress. Although improving it is thought that it will take a week or two yet for him to recover. On Tuesday Congressman McMillin, of Tennessee was elected Speaker, pro tempore, and the House at once proceeded to business. The past two days have been devoted to the introduction of bills of which there seems to be no end.

THE PENNSYLVANIA Railroad company is getting in shape to spend \$1,200,000 in putting the road in excellent shape for the Columbia exposition travel in 1892. Orders have been placed in the company's shops for the construction of 100 new locomotives, and 150 bright new passenger cars will be placed on the line by the opening of another year. Thirty miles of new double track will be built on the P. W. Wayne line and numerous sidings laid.

PRESIDENT HARRISON in his annual message estimates that the pension expenditures for the coming year will be largely increased above the President's figures by the hundreds of thousands of cases in which pensions have not yet been granted. When Abraham Lincoln proposed to purchase the slaves of the south for \$200,000,000, and then set them free, there were those who alluded to the proposition because of the great amount of money involved in it.

ON NEW YEAR'S day the Philadelphia Record issued a souvenir number which, as a newspaper marvel, was one of the greatest of this age of progress. In printing the edition 81 tons of paper were used, over 150,000 copies issued, each copy contained 48 pages. The Record is one of the best papers in the United States in almost every other paper in Philadelphia in circulation and in politics it is as true to tariff-reform and the best interests of the people as the needle is to the pole.

THE chances for a war with Chili seem to be daily growing less. A late dispatch from Valparaiso says: It has been learned that the Government's cable to Minister Montt, at Washington, was a withdrawal of the offensive paragraphs in Senator Matta's letter in reply to President Harrison's message. It is believed that the three men found guilty of stabbing the Baltimore seaman will be punished publicly during the festivities just beginning in honor of the victory over Balnacada.

THE Governor of Kansas, says the New York World, disregarding the just respect of the Farmers' Alliance that he summons the Legislature to elect a Senator representing the people, has appointed a Republican to succeed Mr. Plumb. To aggravate his offense he has appointed ex-Congressman Bishop W. Perkins, who was one of the many mis-representatives in the Billion Dollar Congress defeated for re-election in 1890. Mr. Perkins is a free-trader Republican of ordinary ability and a considerable gift of the gab.

Against the decisions of the Supreme Court.

Against the decisions of the Supreme Court, handed down on Monday last at Philadelphia, was that of Caroline Davis against Felix McKnight, which sustains the decision of the Common Pleas Court, of Allegheny county, granting a recovery under a statute little known and seldom invoked, which makes saloon-keepers responsible in damages for injuries resulting from their sale of liquor to intoxicated persons. On a night in October, 1890, Robert Davies, the husband of the plaintiff, became very much intoxicated on liquor furnished by the defendant, and on his way home fell in a gutter and lay there. The gutter was full of water and the unfortunate man contracted an attack of pneumonia from which he died. A jury gave his widow substantial damages.

The saloon-keepers' only ground of defense were that the liquor was not the proximate cause of death and that what Davies drank he drank voluntarily. The decision is one that all saloon-keepers should make a note of and conduct their business in such a way as to keep their customers from carrying more than twenty pounds to the square inch.

One of the most important results to flow from the political change in New York will be an appointment of representatives in the State Legislature. For many years the Republicans, holding the Legislature by an unfair apportionment upon an old basis of population, have persistently refused to allow the law relating to the equal distribution of representatives among the people. While the Democrats have had a majority in the State, electing the Governor and other State officials, the Republicans, through fraudulent control of the Legislature, have been enabled to send United States Senators to Washington in defiance of the will of the people. This has been a disfranchisement of the people of New York and a fraud upon the whole country. But the new Legislature of New York will at last put an end to this flagrant violation of the principles of representation.

THE McKimley bill, says the Pittsburg Post, put a tariff of 25 per cent of value on watches, watch cases, movements and crystals. As in all other instances, this was proposed to enable the American watch manufacturers to compete with their European rival without honoring the wages of the American workmen. Yet the news is that the employees of the Waltham Watch Company are about to strike on account of a recent reduction in their wages, and that for the same reason certain of the employees of the Elgin (Ill.) National Watch Company have already struck and are ready to get going ready to go out. The fact is that a high tariff enables manufacturers to establish a monopoly and pay what wages they will. Where competition is working its natural results combination steps in.

THE Philadelphia Record of the 3rd inst. says: The United States Supreme Court by a vote of 6 to 3, has reversed the decision of the Supreme Court in Nebraska by which Governor Boyd was unseated and Governor Thayer allowed to hold over on the ground of Governor Boyd's disqualification, it having been asserted that he was not a naturalized citizen. His citizenship had been affirmed by the Supreme Court, both because of his own act in taking out final naturalization papers when his citizenship was brought in question, and by virtue of the act of Congress admitting Nebraska into the Union, which provided that all its inhabitants should be citizens. The new Year commences well in bringing Democracy into possession of the hard-earned fruits of victory.

PRESIDENT BARKER was in Pittsburg, last week, at a meeting that Senator Quay had with the Republican managers in the western part of the State. It has since come to pass that Quay and Harrison, will not likely be utilizing the same quill and it may be that Postmaster Barker to be a good Harrison man and a strong adherent of Quay's at the same time. Collector Brooks, of Philadelphia, was recently relieved of a lot of patronage on account of his being too friendly to some one other than Harrison, and it has been as good as officially given out that federal office holders are expected to recognize the hand that feeds them and help the administration if it comes to a fight with Quay.

THE following amendments to the McKimley tariff law were introduced in the House at Washington, on Tuesday: "By Mr. Martin of Indiana, to repeal the sugar bounty law; by Mr. Watson of Georgia, to place jute bagging, jute, iron and binding twine on the free list; by Mr. Andrew of Massachusetts, placing raw wool, coal and iron ore on the free list; by Mr. Stone of Kentucky, for free entry of lumber, tin plate and terra cotta; by Mr. Goodnight, of Kentucky, placing salt on the free list; by Mr. McCree, of Kentucky, placing tin plate and agricultural implements on the free list.

THE postage stamp will be fifty-two years old in May. Its inventor was a printer James Chalmers, of Dundee, Scotland, who died in 1853. England, fifty-two years ago, introduced the new system of prepaying letter postage, and according to a decree of Dec. 21, 1839, issued the first stamps, which were to be put before the public on May 6 of the following year. A year later they were introduced in the United States and were common in Bavaria, Belgium and France.

Washington Letter.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Jan. 2nd, 1892. A prominent Democratic member of the House Committee on Appropriations, talked very interestingly of the situation to your correspondent. He said: "I am afraid that there is a disposition on the part of Democrats to expect too much from the present House. Reform under our form of government does not necessarily come slow, even where both branches of Congress and the Executive are in accord. We have to contend against a hostile Senate and Executive, but we hope to come about some reform in the tariff and in the expenditure of the government. There may be a slight difference of opinion in the party about whether it would be best for the House to prepare and pass an entire tariff bill, according to Democratic ideas of what such a measure should be, or to pass a number of bills correcting the inequalities of the present tariff law; but there can be no doubt that these plans are the most likely to bring practical results. The first bill, of course, to be passed by the House, but it could not possibly be passed by the Senate, while there is reason for believing that several of the latter can be gotten through the Senate, thus throwing the responsibility for their defeat upon Mr. Harrison.

"Now as to appropriations. I do not know what will be the result of the effort to have all the appropriations bills restored to the Appropriation committee, but personally I agree with Mr. Holman in believing that the accomplishment would materially aid in cutting down the total of appropriations. I cannot say just where we shall make reductions, but I will say that the House will have to make a very careful study of the subject in my opinion. I think we can make a very large reduction in the total amount appropriated, without interfering in the slightest way with the workings of any useful branch of the government service, and that in the task which we have set for ourselves, and in which we mean a light one, as we shall have to do battle with the Republican Senate over the many extravagant amendments certain to be added to the appropriation bills by that body, which constantly grows more extravagant in its ideas."

SPEAKER CRISP has so far recovered from his attack of the grip as to be able to do a little talking on the new rules of the House with his Democratic colleagues of the committee on Rules, Messrs. McMillin and Cottingham, but it is not thought that the new rules will be reported to the House for a couple of weeks, but that will not retard business much, as the House will work under the rules of the Fifty-fifth Congress until the new ones are ready.

MR. MILLS has almost entirely regained his health and is daily seen on the streets, building himself up by taking long walks.

THERE are no new developments in the Chilton situation. The administration having sufficiently stirred up the country is now waiting to make up its mind what to do next. The Republicans cannot hide the anxiety they feel about Mr. Blaine's intentions; they want to know just what he intends doing, so that they may trim their sails accordingly, and all sorts of devices have been resorted to in the hope of getting the very Secretary of State to declare in favor of Blaine as the party's candidate. Dudley called on Mr. Blaine and devoted almost an hour to the most persuasive arguments he knew how to make, but Mr. Blaine declined to commit himself.

REPRESENTATIVE SPRINGER says he has received many letters from all parts of the country, commending his plan of attacking the McKimley tariff bill in sections. Mr. Blaine having been elected by the means of separate bills providing for the amendment, or contingent repeal of the worst sections of that law. Mr. Springer thinks that the committee on ways and means will report a number of these separate tariff bills during the session, and that they will be put through the House without any unnecessary delay.

THE Republicans shouted too soon about what being put upon the free list by the reciprocity treaty with the British West India Islands. The official schedule of the treaty, it is now made public, and the best that wheat, corn, oats, salt or pickled pork and beef gets, is a reduction of 25 per cent in the existing duties.

BURIED ALIVE. St. Petersburg, Jan. 4.—Intelligence reached here to-day of a fearful accident that occurred at Rosolowick, a village in Russia. Poland. It appears that a physician who had been practicing at that place recently became ill, and, to all appearances, died. The body was interred in a few hours after the mourners had departed from the cemetery. Some men who were engaged about the grounds were started by hearing a succession of the most unearthly shrieks, which to all appearances came from the newly filled grave. At first the men fled in confusion, but in a short time their courage returned. Shovels were procured and the earth was hastily removed from the grave and the coffin lifted out. Upon opening the coffin it was found that the doctor had been alive when he was buried, but that he had subsequently died from suffocation.

WOULD RATHER BURN. WILKESBORO, January 3.—Charles Wall, the Wyoming county wife murderer, has addressed a letter to Governor Patton asking for his excellency to authorize the authorities of Wyoming county to burn him (Wall) to death instead of inflicting the death-penalty by the usual mode of hanging. Wall murdered his wife with an axe last June. He was jealous. On the morning of the murder he lay in wait for his wife. When she appeared in the back yard he knocked her down with an axe and nearly severed the head from the body. The murderer is repentant now. He spends all of his time in reading the Bible. Dr. Graves Found Guilty of the Murder of Mrs. Barnaby.

The jury on the trial of Dr. C. Thatchler Graves, in Denver, Col., for the murder of Mrs. Barnaby, on Saturday night brought in a verdict of murder in the first degree.

Dr. Graves was Mrs. Barnaby's physician and business man in the East—where they both resided for some time—since she went on a visit West with a female companion, and while in Denver received by express a bottle of whisky, which she partook of and soon died from the effects. The whisky was poisoned, and the jury thought Graves sent it to her for the purpose of killing her and profiting by her death. The expenses of the trial were not less than \$50,000 on each side.
