Judge Barker on Licenses.

Before granting the licenses last week Judge Barker took occasion to deliver the following opinion:

We filed in court last year, at the time we disposed of applications for licenses, a written opinion, embodying our views as to the proper construction to be placed on the laws in reference to licenses generally.

This is a useless and senseless thing for anyone to do, for the obvious reason that the courts cannot act on information so received. Anonymous letters are not worthy of notice, and every applicant is entitled to have notice in open court of any charges made against him, and to have the opportunity of information furnished in such a manner that we cannot make it known in open court.

Second, we are convinced that many of the evils flowing from the use of intoxicating liquors result from the facilities which are afforded for the sale of such liquors at the hour of the night, and we, therefore, request all persons to whom licenses are granted to close their places of business at 10 o'clock.

Third, we do not regard females as suitable persons to whom licenses should be granted. We believe that if females are granted licenses, they will be used to the detriment of the community.

A former Ebensburg hotel. A terrible accident occurred at the converting factory of the Carnegie Bros. & Co., mill at Homestead, Allegheny county, on Saturday morning, which eight men were seriously injured, one of whom, Andrew Stoffield, died on Sunday.

The accident happened during a melt in the converter, and was caused by the skull of the falling metal into the pit. The falling metal covered eight of the men, before they had time to escape and buried them under a mass of molten iron.
