



A horrible discovery has been made a the mountains of South Dakota. bout ten miles from the border, which ndicates that a party of people have een driven to the dire extremity of feeding upon each other. In a deep canyon, where the camp was sheltered from the storms, says the Globe-Demperat, there were found the remains of a camp and of a fire, in the ashes of which were several bones and pieces of human body which had been cooker and partly eaten. There had evidently been five or six in the party, and three of them had been killed to furnish food for the others, for there were three skulls found, and from their size it i evident that all of them were those of women or children, for they were much smaller than the skull of a man. 
